

Implementation Directions for Student Emergency Relief Fund

Last Amended on on March 26,2025

1. These Implementation Directions are established to offer timely relief to students who are in urgent need of assistance, giving full play to the spirit of helping others in distress with the care and compassion from the community.
2. Students enrolled in the University may apply for the emergency relief fund in any of the following conditions within six months after the occurrence of the incident:
 - (1)The student is injured or dies due to illness, accident
 - (a) If a student is hospitalized for more than seven days due to injury or illness, NT\$5,000 be granted.
 - (b) If a student meets the National Health Insurance criteria for major injury or illness, NT\$50,000 may be granted.
 - (c) If a student dies in an accident, NT\$20,000 may be granted
 - (2)Parents suffer from serious injury or death.
 - (a) If one of the parents meets the National Health Insurance criteria for major injury or illness, NT\$20,000 may be granted.
 - (b) If one of the parents dies, NT\$30,000 may be granted
 - (3) If a student's family suffers from devastating disasters (e.g., winds, flood, earthquake, fire).
 - (a) For those whose houses are partially destroyed, NT\$10,000. may be granted.
 - (b) For those whose houses are completely destroyed or collapsed, NT\$30,000 may be granted.
 - (c) If the student's parents were hospitalized due to injuries for more than seven days, an additional NT\$10,000 may be granted.
 - (4) If a student who has been abused, abandoned, or forced to engage in improper occupations by their parents, resulting in them unable to live with their family or being placed in a social welfare institution approved by the government or taken in by their relatives, NT\$20,000 may be granted.
For students from financially disadvantaged families, an additional NT\$5,000 may be granted for low-and-middle income households and an additional NT\$10,000 for low-income households on top of the original relief fund granted.
3. Sources of fund:
 - (1)The NT\$840,000 raised by the Department of Industrial Education in 1989 and the interest earned thereon.
 - (2) Donations from the faculty, staff and students of the University.
 - (3) Donations from philanthropic people in the community.

- (4) Contributions from the student public funds and incentive funds of the University.
- (5) Others.

4. The student himself/herself (relatives), or the adviser, fills in the application form and attaches relevant supporting documents. After the adviser or department head signs and comments, it is sent to the Student Affairs Office's Life Counseling Section for issuance.
5. The emergency relief fund shall be applied only once by the same student for the same incident.
6. In major or special cases, the amount of relief may be increased as appropriate after the Vice President for Student Affairs convenes relevant personnel for review, depending on the actual situation.
7. These Implementation Directions and any amendments thereto become effective after approval by the Student Affairs Council and ratification by the University President.
